

### ADAPTATION OF THE BRS REPORTING TEMPLATE AS PART OF THE COLLECTION OF INFORMATION UNDER DECISION MC-1/21

Information on the work of Regional Centres in delivering capacity-building and technical assistance to support parties in implementing their obligations under the Minamata Convention was requested, inter alia, by the Conference of the Parties to the Minamata Convention in its First meeting in 2017 through decision MC-1/21.

The Minamata Convention Secretariat has adapted the "template for reporting requirements and the performance evaluation of regional centres under the Basel and Stockholm Conventions." ## 1 - Sub-Regional Workshops For Francophone African Countries On The Ratification And Implementation Of The Minamata Convention On Mercury

During the Workshop, participants shared on lectures, group exercises and training sessions based on:

- the processes of signature, ratification and implementation of the Minamata Convention,
- the different sources of support available,
- the opportunities for exchange and actions at the national, sub regional and regional levels.

It registered 40 African country representatives (focal points of Minamata convention from African ACP countries) and other partners of institutions International and regional agencies such as CBCRS-AF (See Annex 1, list of participants).



## 2 – African Region Working Session to Support The Ratification and Effective And Implementation Of The Minamata Convention On Mercury

The Workshop included lectures, group exercises and training sessions and focused on the overview and implementation of Convention obligations. Certain countries shared on progress in implementing their national roadmaps and the proposals for further support needed (work individually or in small groups). The opportunity to consider issues for the African region and the progress towards the first meeting of the Conference of the Parties was discussed.

53 African countries representatives (focal points for BRS and Minamata conventions) and other partner institutions International and regional agencies such as CBCRS-AF, (See Annex 2, list of participants).

# 3- Annual workshop of Focal Point on Synergetic Implementation of Multilateral Environmental Agreements Chemical Cluster and Best Practices

The Workshop was to primarily focus on areas where synergies exist or can be developed across the conventions, while also paying attention to key issues specific to the fledgling Minamata Convention on Mercury in the context of Africa. It was intended for 23 African focal points of Minamata and BRS Conventions and other partners of institutions International and regional agencies such as CBCRS-AF, (see Annex 3, list of participants). The Workshop included lectures, group exercises and training sessions and will seek to:

- Assist focal points with analyzing and capitalizing on existing overlaps in the chemical cluster of conventions, with a particular focus on the newly effectual Minamata Convention on Mercury in anticipation of its Second Conference of Parties in 2018
- Explore ways how the BCRC/SCRC-FA in Dakar, can continue to support its African focal points on the aforementioned issues on a regular basis in the future, with special considerations given to the end of the current period of SAICM in 2020 and the upcoming third phase of the ACP MEAs capacity building project in Africa.
